Okay, you're back this month – Concept 1 didn't scare you off! Where Concept 1 states that "Final Responsibility and ultimate authority for A.A. world services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship", Concept 2 states, "The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and the effective conscience of our whole society in its world affairs". So, Concept 1 defines where the responsibility and authority lie, and Concept 2 defines how that comes about.

Our whole society participates in all matters concerning our world affairs through their delegated representative to the General Service Conference. Did you know that Delegate Area 09, Mid-Southern California Area, (which consists of all the A.A. groups in Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino and that part of Los Angeles County that lies south of Rosecrans Boulevard) is the largest population of A.A. Groups and A.A. members in the entire Fellowship? Hey, being that big, shouldn't we have more representation at the General Service Conference than, say, Alaska, or Nevada, who we absolutely dwarf in sheer numbers? Well, no, because the General Service Conference does not consist of representatives who go to guard the self-interest of their delegate areas. The Conference consists of delegates, one each elected by each of the 93 Delegate Areas, who are charged with the responsibility of seeking what is best for our whole society, as the Concept says. The 3rd Legacy Procedure that is the method used to elect Delegates pretty much removes politics from the process of the election, (no matter what you may hear, General Service is not "just politics", except in the true spirit and definition of the word – the few doing what is best for the many). Concept 2 is the principle that removes the selfinterest.

Next month, Concept 3 – "To insure effective leadership, we should endow each element of A.A. – the Conference, the General Service Board and its service corporations, staffs, committees, and executives – with a traditional "Right of Decision", The first of several rights defined in the next three Concepts.

Turn RIGHT onto SOUTH ST.0.5 miles .


Turn LEFT onto CLARK AVE.<0.1 miles.
