International SOS Conference

(1st Annual International Sober-Over-Sixty Conference)

From May 18 – 21, 2006, the First International Sober-Over-Sixty (SOS) Conference will be held in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii. The Theme of the conference will be "serenity not senility" – carrying the message to seniors. The conference will be open to all ages, and is tentatively scheduled to include a Resource Review, Panel & Workshops, Speaker, AA Speaker Meeting, 2 "Sober-Over-Sixty Meetings, a Spiritual Meeting, a "What's on Your Mind" meeting. In addition, several entertainment and "Hawaii fun" activities are tentatively scheduled. Tradition 9 (long form)

Our A.A. experience has taught us that:

Each A. A. group needs the least possible organization. Rotating leadership is the best. The small group may elect its secretary, the large group its rotating committee, and the groups of a large metropolitan area their central or intergroup committee, which often employs a full-time secretary. The trustees of the General Service Board are, in effect, our A.A. General Service Committee. They are the custodians of our A.A. Tradition and the receivers of voluntary A.A. contributions by which we maintain our A.A. General Service Office at New York. They are authorized by the groups to handle our overall public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principal newspaper, the A.A. Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in A.A. are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.


Design Contest

Proposals (to be voted on at Sep.11 MSCA Assembly)

On Aug. 14, 2005, the MSC ASC voted to put the following proposals on the Sep.11 Assembly agenda. (Note that GSRs and other MSCA Assembly members will discuss and vote on these proposals at the Sep. 11 Assembly.)

- 1. 2006 MSCA Meeting Schedule (Bruce H)...(Note: see the proposed schedule on last page of this newsletter)
- 2. New Area 09 Expense and Budget Policy (Mike M)
- 3. Change the name of the MSCA "Correctional **Facilities** Committee" to "Corrections Committee" (Alex N)
- 4. Modify the Newsletter Committee Guidelines to allow for the listing of Central Offices and other useful AA websites on the MSCA website. (Nick M)

Specifics: Modify Article VIII, Heading E Section 4, sub-section b, Hyperlinks to Outside.

Old:

b. "The MSCA will not include links to other AA group Web Sites, except as noted above, since we cannot monitor the content of acceptability of any other AA Group's Web Site."

New:

b. "Web sites not covered in VIII.E.4.a above for example. Central Offices and the PRAASA - may be added to the MSCA website, subsequent to approval by the EMSC, or the MSCA Assembly."

5. Modify the Newsletter Committee Guidelines to assign general responsibility for the content of the MSCA website. (Nick M)

Specifics: Add Article VIII, Heading E, Section 3, subsection e

- e. General responsibility for content of the MSCA website shall be retained by the EMSC acting as a deliberative body. This assignment of responsibility is in keeping with the Right of Decision outlined in Concept 3, service responsibility matched by an equal service authority as outlined in Concept 10, and the guarantee that no members will ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over other members, as outlined in the Warranties of Concept 12. Regarding website content, the EMSC will be guided by the force of AA Tradition and the 12 Concepts of World Service. MSCA Assembly shall retain final responsibility and ultimate authority for the content of the MSCA website.
- 6. Budget Override for Delegate Expenses at the 2005 International Convention (Nancy J)
- 7. Budget Override for GSR School (Felipe G)


