Monthly SPOTLIGHT on OUR MSCA Trusted Servants Maryka dO.

"Service entered my life from day one. I was asked to fill out name tags for a marathon meeting in exchange for a hamburger. I was hungry and without a home, so of course, I said yes. From that day forward, I was hooked on service. Today, I do it in exchange for my sobriety."

Maryka's service work has included GSR, DCM, DCMC of Districts 1 and 4, plus Chair of the Southwest Alano Club for three years. She currently serves Area 9 as our Guidelines and Policies (GAP) chairperson, and she is a proud active member of the Remote Communities Committee. Maryka was also instrumental in getting the Remote Communities Committee established and served as the chair of the Ad Hoc Committee.

She was faced with two significant health challenges in sobriety, which created a sense of isolation: homelessness and cancer. Understanding the lethal power of isolation, she has, even more, focused her attention on those alcoholics with face health, gender, geographic cultural, and/or socioeconomic barriers. Her belief is that recovery must be available to all who want it, regardless of circumstances beyond their control.

"We speak together—one alcoholic talking to another, and subsequently, lives are healed and contented sobriety follows. I am so very thankful for that marker and name tag on my very first day in AA. Thank you Alcoholics Anonymous!"
