





Usually, when the term "Alcoholics Anonymous" is mentioned, people are inclined to believe that it is a force that is in operation in some distant area. Little thought is given to the possibility that some of the 700,000 members of Alcoholics Anonymous may be close to this section . . . or in it.

There is something genuinely wholesome about this movement. It is an organization of men and women who know the depth to which drink can cause men to go and who recognize the spiritual force which can help men back upon their feet again. Alcoholic Anonymous is made up of individuals who know the horrors of a "Lost Weekend" and who, through suffering, have won the desire to help others to gain freedom from such suffering. It is an organization without dues, without fees, an entity that asks nothing but the unselfish right to help others attain renewed and revived self respect.

Why should an editorial be written on the subject of Alcoholics Anonymous? The answer is simple enough. There are individuals within this community who need the help of A. A. There are others who have been won back to respectabilty through Alcoholics Anonymous who live near this city (or perhaps in it), who would be happy to see the program available in this community. Perhaps this editorial can give a helping hand to those who are thinking in this unselfish vein. Perhaps some individual who needs the aid of Alcoholics Anonymous may be influenced to recognize this movement as a decent gesture of genuine friendship, an act of the highest type of good sportsmanship, a cause worthy of a respectful hearing. In other words The Enterprise-Journal recognizes an alcoholic as an individual who is ill. Alcoholism is a disease. The victim deserves help, not condemnation . . . and the members of Alcoholics Anonymous know how to help. turn down an offer for help from a member of A. A. The suggestion may be a good tip to you....And if those interested seek to associate themselves with individuals needing help in McComb or Summit, Magnolia or Osyka, well, clear the way for their good work if you receive even a hint of an opportunity. Mind you, no names are mentioned.



The idea for the story, appropriately titled "One Too Many," is Kroger Babb's. He is an independent producer who has made only a film on sex education and one on a religious subject. He is not a member of AA, but he knows something about the problem of alcoholism or he wouldn't be interested.

Like all AA's, these two ladies are rapturously articulate about the help they got and the work AA is doing, and like all AA's, they have a fine sense of humor and are not at all embarrassed to call themselves "ex-drunks."

One, in middle age, carefully groomed, expensively dressed and well-jewelled, is a former officer who helped start the organization. The other, young, blond and pretty, does public relations. I wondered why a movement that lives on

anonymity does public rela-

tions. "Only to protect our anonymity," she said.

AA, said the former officer, has no "policy-it has traditions." They came here at Babb's invitation and expense to see if the script conformed to AA traditions. Generally, it did.

The story will tell how alcoholism affects the lives of drinkers and non-drinkers in a small community. AA folks come to the rescue, but not in a flagwaving or preachy manner. AA doesn't like preachiness. Only a few things had to be altered in the script, like:

When the girl's husband tells her she is an alcoholic, she doesn't bat an eye. She just accepts it. But that isn't true to life, said these technical ad-"We know." they in-"We know how we resisted. acted the first time .

In another scene the "alky" (AA term for drinkers) buys three half pints of whisky so the bottles will fit easily into her small handbag. Bosh, said the ladies, "all alkys carry BIG handbags. That's the pattern an actres sat an AA meeting in Beverly Hills the other night asked if they still carry big handbags. We assured her they do."

When a doctor is called, in the first version, one character asks, "is he a drunk?" the advisers told the writers. was wrong. AA doesn't care whether a doctor is an AA or not and, besides, the suggestion would be offensive.

A switch will be effected in "One Too Many" which should please newspapermen but not their wives. Many pictures show reporters as alcoholics; in this, the reporter's wife is a victim of the disease AA is fighting.

AA will get no money for lending its name and traditions to the picture. AA does not accept Its activities are carried funds. on by contributions, averaging \$1 a year per person, from its many thousand members.


