## Tis the Season to be Jolly - By Area 09 Grapevine Chair 🔌



Whether you love the holidays or intensely dislike them, they are here! I've been working on not using the word "hate" for a long time. Ever since recoiling from hearing my little children say, "I hate this, I hate that." "I hate green beans!" That seems a bit harsh for green beans! Tis the season to be jolly! Yikes, seems like I'm already putting on the "jolly!" Do I really need to do extra jolly from Oct 31st to Jan 2nd? What an order, I can't go through with it! To quote a service sponsor, "Create the fellowship you crave!" So, let's create the holiday we crave!

When I was new, it was hard explaining to my family that I would be in marathon meetings from October to January, but they were so grateful that I was sober, they objected little. Questions abounded: What do I want? What can my life look like? What can my recovery look like? And how can it be a part of my life?

I recall the year with no Christmas tree, feeling overwhelmed, with a toddler, a newborn, and everything it took to stay sober. So, off we'd go to Frank and Susan's home (not their real names), recovery friends who invited alcoholics into their home for an evening of food, fun, and sometimes tears for those we'd lost over the past year. Our three-year-old was able to experience a tree with a gift or two for him. I was able to relax and enjoy their efforts to stay sober, and help others do the same during the Holiday season, but most valuable to me, love and a sober family!

Getting back to love and hate, I've been in a quandary lately as I hear newcomers say, "I love this meeting! I just love A.A.!" Don't get me wrong, I'm so grateful that A.A. was right where I could find it when my Higher Power, the Spirit of the Universe, got my attention. And I'm grateful A.A. is there for others. But love?

I think it's a bit of a love/hate relationship like with the holidays and getting jolly. Seems like my Higher Power has been revealing to me lately that love and hate convey actions like a fellow home group member driving that homeless, toothless, often a bit smelly fellow A.A. to the shelter in the opposite direction of their own home. Or a willingness to meet the transgendered woman to work the Steps before the meeting, even though the group secretary told me, "You must tell him that he may not attend the women's meeting." Thank goodness I took my sponsor's advice when I asked if I really needed to tell her she could not come to the women's meeting. I'm so glad my sponsor's Higher Power gave her the words, "You tell those ladies that if they have a problem, confront her themselves and leave you out of it!" What a freedom that was for me, and guess what? The chance to work the Steps with someone and watch the lights come on in her eyes was exactly what my recovery needed at the time. It kept me far from the first drink.

Years later, I can really feel a love for my Higher Power and the lessons that I was present enough to see. This, to me, is an example of God's love in action. So, this season, this holiday, live your big messy incredible lives – you can either make them your own, or you can make them helpful, beautiful, and incredible for someone else – for your Home Group or your District or Area by giving your hands, feet, minds, and presence. In other words, give your love!


Announcing: Hardcover Jacketless Format



### An historical note from the G.S.O. Archives


This is not the first instance that printing supplies have necessitated adapting the format of the Big Book. During World War II, to conform with directives from the U.S. government to all publishers to decrease paper consumption in their publications, the Big Book's trim size was reduced in 1945. Samples of this "wartime Big Book" edition are on display at the G.S.O. Archives in New York City.

With this jacketless adaptation of our hardcovers, starting with our beloved "bestsellers" the hardcover Big Book and hardcover Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, we in A.A. are once again showing great resilience in the face of obstacles posed by world events!

As always, we encourage ordering the Big Book and all of our items of literature from local distribution sources—groups, districts, areas, Intergroups and Central Offices—as they play a vital role in local Twelfth Step activities.
