My Service with Spanish-Speaking Women in AA, by Carmen M

My sobriety date is August 10, 1998. My home group is Women's Solution and my Hispanic home group is Tal Como Lo Ve Ella, both meeting in Tustin, on Wednesday and Friday at 8pm, respectively. I have a sponsor who I see on Wednesdays, which I'm very grateful for, having not had a sponsor for 10 years, which I wouldn't recommend. I was not a happy person and very controlling. Working with a sponsor has changed my life for the better; working the Steps and putting principles before personalities has helped me be a better person and to get in the middle of AA, including service work in Area 09.

How I got involved in Area 09 is all God's work. One day in my Saturday morning meeting, I reached out to a woman to see if she knew of any Hispanic meetings or groups since most of my meetings were in English in Orange County. I was in a new neighborhood and hoping to get involved with the AA Spanish-speaking community. I had done some outreach for the SoCal Convention, but it didn't go very well because most of the groups I visited were very small. I wasn't sure how to start a conversation at a new meeting, feeling like a newcomer in new meetings.

It's amazing how God works! It took a couple of months before Nancy H. informed me about the 2rd Hispanic Women's Workshop in December 2017 in Pasadena. I couldn't believe she remembered me, and next thing you know we were going to the Workshop early one Saturday morning. It was amazing when we arrived. I saw a room full of women that looked like me. I had been attending women's conferences, dinners, and meetings most of my sobriety with my sponsor, but none with Spanish-speaking women, so this was very special. They spoke Spanish and it was something I enjoyed. Growing up as a child we only spoke Spanish at home and not much anywhere else, so anytime I got the opportunity to speak Spanish I did. I had finally found a room full of AA Women speaking Spanish! I distributed my phone number, and they handed me their group cards with locations and meeting times.

I had some idea about what the Hispanic AA community was like before attending the Workshop, which was based on the small groups I had visited while serving as the Hispanic group liaison for the SoCal Convention. It turns out that there are only a few Spanish-speaking women in AA in our Area, maybe only two or three women for every 15 men. Who knew?

A month later after the Workshop, Nancy asked if I was interested in serving as the liaison for Area 09 at the 3rd Hispanic Women's Workshop in San Francisco in December, 2018. Having learned to not say NO to an AA request, I said YES. I wasn't exactly sure what I had said yes to but I was ready for a challenge, and I would be reaching out to Spanish-speaking AA women, which was awesome! I was able to be part of the Spanish Orange County Convention as the liaison to the Hispanic Women's Workshop. It's so interesting how everything came together. My work with the SoCal Convention prepared me to visit the Hispanic groups in Orange County, which was a lot different, and I was not alone anymore. I'm truly grateful for this experience where I learned enough to be prepared to serve as chair for the 4th Hispanic Women's Workshop, in Placentia in December, 2019.

I'm truly blessed because I continue to be of service in Area 09, reaching out to all the AA women in our Area. I keep learning and growing in my sobriety. My God loves us all and prepares us for challenges we can handle. I've been told to do the work and forget about the results, to do the right thing. My circle of AA women has grown so much and I know I'm not alone.


What's New in A.A.?

Announcing: Hardcover Jacketless Format
Big Book and Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions

We are delighted to announce a new hardcover format of our most popular books:

- A new jacketless format of the hardcover Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous (Item B-1)
- A new jacketless format of the hardcover Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions (Item B-2)

These new formats will become available for ordering in late November 2022.

An historical note from the G.S.O. Archives

This is not the first instance that printing supplies have necessitated adapting the format of the Big Book. During World War II, to conform with directives from the U.S. government to all publishers to decrease paper consumption in their publications, the Big Book's trim size was reduced in 1945. Samples of this "wartime Big Book" edition are on display at the G.S.O. Archives in New York City.

With this jacketless adaptation of our hardcovers, starting with our beloved "bestsellers" the hardcover Big Book and hardcover Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, we in A.A. are once again showing great resilience in the face of obstacles posed by world events!

As always, we encourage ordering the Big Book and all of our items of literature from local distribution sources—groups, districts, areas, Intergroups and Central Offices—as they play a vital role in local Twelfth Step activities.
