He was quite prompt in preparing his Conference Report, which is dated May 3, 2023, only days after returning from the GSC. What Is A Delegate "Shareback?"

(Now that Mitchell is back from the Conference, he will be sharing his thoughts to anyone who will listen. In 2020 and 2021, I shared 23 times each year with Groups, Districts, and the Area. So, for a third month in a row, I'm sharing Jay R.'s great description of what this entails. Ed L., editor)

The 2021 - 2023 Edition of The A.A. Service Manual outlines the awesome responsibilities of our elected Area Delegates:

"Delegates are charged with understanding the experiences, viewpoints and group conscience of their areas, while assuming responsibility for the U.S./Canada Conference as a whole." (p 32)

There are currently 93 Area Delegates, each elected into their service positions by their respective Areas, in the North American (U.S./Canada) A.A. service structure.

Among their many responsibilities, the Area Delegates represent their Areas at the annual General Service Conference (GSC) in New York. In preparation for the annual GSC, each Delegate must become familiar with the long list of Conference agenda items. They must also interact with Groups and members to gather the "group conscience" of their Area. A well informed Delegate will be better prepared to participate in the Conference, and carry the Area's group conscience in matters affecting A.A. as a whole.

Once the General Service Conference is finished, the Delegates are then tasked with reporting back to their respective Areas the outcomes of the Conference. Some refer to this as a "report-back" or "shareback."

Mid Southern California Area 9 covers a large geographical portion of Southern California, represents 24 Districts and more than 2,000 A.A. Groups. In order to more efficiently carry GSC information, it is common for Districts and Groups to organize joint meetings or events at which our Delegate is invited to present a "shareback" from the Conference.

Our Area 9 Delegate, Mitchell B, will no doubt be busy from now until the end of the year reporting back to our Groups and Districts. He will be giving "sharebacks" both in person and via Zoom. Have you ever wondered about the role of Public Information (PI) Committees in our fellowship? The purpose of these committees is to help carry the message of A.A. to the public, media, and professionals, and to inform them about what A.A. is, what it does, and what it does not do.

The primary function of a PI Committee is to create awareness of A.A.'s existence and to offer information about the program of recovery. The PI Committee seeks to provide accurate information about the A.A. program to those who may be seeking help for themselves or someone they know. The committee may also reach out to professionals who work with people who may need the help of A.A.

One of the most critical roles of the PI Committee is to dispel myths and misconceptions about A.A. Many people have false beliefs about what A.A. is and what it does. These misunderstandings can be a barrier to those who may benefit from our program. The PI Committee seeks to clarify what A.A. is and what it is not so that those who are seeking help can make informed decisions.

As a member of Alcoholics Anonymous, you can play an essential role in the PI Committee. Attending your local District's General Service meeting and joining the PI Committee can help ensure that accurate information about A.A. is available to those who need it. Additionally, the Mid Southern California Area 09 Business meeting holds a monthly meeting, both in-person and on Zoom, where you can learn more about the PI Committee's work and how you can help.

Participation in the PI Committee is an excellent way to carry the message of A.A. to the public. By doing so, you help to ensure that A.A. continues to be available to those who may need it. 



Area 09 Communications Committee Guidelines Adopted!

With the adoption of the new <u>Technologies Committee</u> <u>Guidelines in 2022</u>, it is time to reconsider and revise the old <u>Communications Committee Guidelines from January 2009</u>. At the January 2023 Assembly, Ed L. was elected as the new Communications Committee Chair. At the February Area Service Committee Ed presented <u>background information</u> describing the redundancies between these two committees and presented the new revised guidelines, which are intended to resolve these redundancies, and may be <u>viewed here</u>. In a unanimous vote of support, the revised Guidelines were adopted as final on May 21, 2023 at the May Assembly.
