Happy New Year from the Editor

Beginning in 2014, when I served as your Area 09 Grapevine Chair, through the beginning of 2024, as your outgoing Communications Chair and Newsletter Editor, I have been rocketed into the Fourth Dimension through exercising General Service. Never, not once, have I said "yes" to anything in General Service that I knew how to do. In saying "yes," I've been exposed to previous Area committee chairs and officers who were always there - always - to answer questions and help me understand what I just volunteered for.

In 2010, as I sat at the top of the Alamodome in San Antonio, TX at the A.A. International Convention, I looked down onto the main floor where A.A.'s were sitting at speaker-level in folding chairs. The last four or five rows were occupied by the volunteers who wore green t-shirts with "2010" printed in large letters across their shoulder blades. During the countdown, when everyone with one year, then two years, and three years up to year 25 was asked to sit down, most of those green-shirted volunteers were still standing. This was a visual indication to me of the longevity that characterizes our trusted servants, volunteers, and "meeting makers." Volunteers tend to live longer; General Service volunteers do it sober, with enthusiasm, and for fun!

I liken General Service to be kin to a spiritual gym, where we exercise unseen muscles like compassion, tolerance, and patience. For those five years (in the spirit of "stagnation") that I served as the District 19 secretary driving by myself 30 miles across the desert one way, I exercised unflagging commitment. As your Area 09 Grapevine Representative, for two years I felt like the "Maytag Repairman," sitting by myself, exercising availability, envious of the GSR and DCM Schools with their giant crowds of students. As your Area 09 Secretary, I learned about communication and as your Treasurer (for two months), I learned about giving.

On the lower rungs of the General Service ladder, as your Alternate Delegate, I learned to love the ones I'm with; to honor those who showed up without judging those who didn't. In all of these positions, I've learned to be a team player, responsible to those I serve, but never more than as your 2020-2021 Delegate. In this position, I learned that my job was to be sure that you - not me - were heard, that my opinion mattered only as a spokesperson on your behalf, to ensure the Area 09 group conscience was registered at the Conference. During these 10 years, I've had a full-body spiritual experience, and it is with full heart that I thank you for letting me be of service. (Ed L, editor)


