### **Short History of PRAASA**

First Western General Service Assembly

The first Western General Service Assembly was held in Fresno, California, January 26, 27 and 28, 1968.

As early as 1955, Stan W., then Conference Delegate from California Northern Coastal Area, spoke to the other three California delegates about holding a statewide conference of some sort, but no agreement could be reached among the four California delegates, and the plan was abandoned at that time.

In 1967, Mrs. Pat S. of Watsonville, California, was elected as California Northern Coastal Area (CNCA) delegate. During the annual meeting in New York in April of that year, she spoke to the other four California delegates (San Diego-Imperial had been added by that time), but the only delegate to express interest in a statewide conference was Ken K. from California Northern Interior Area (CNIA). However, in further discussions, Paul R., Arizona delegate, and Les E., Nevada delegate, expressed interest in holding a three-state conference to discuss General Service matters.

Upon her return to California, Pat Sims immediately contacted Stan W. in Fairfax, California. Stan had served as secretary of the Northern California Council of Alcoholics Anonymous (NCC) for several terms and was thoroughly familiar with putting on special conferences, assemblies and other special events. Pat asked Stan if he would act as general chairman and put together a three-state conference, including Arizona, Nevada, CNCA and CNIA. Pat S. and Ken K. volunteered to act as co-host for such an event. While this conversation was going on, Edward D., delegate from the State of Oregon, wrote to ask if his state could be included in such a conference.

Stan W. agreed to act as general chairman and was enthusiastic about putting together a special assembly in early 1968; however, he suggested it should include all states and/or areas within the Pacific Region. He contacted all delegates within the Pacific Region, with the exception of the delegate from the State of Idaho (Stan later admitted this was a clear and inadvertent oversight on his part and apologized for his actions at a later date). He received an immediate reply from Ralph B., delegate from the State of Washington, in acceptance; and gradually received word from all delegates within the region, including Alaska and Hawaii, expressing some interest in participating. Stan thereupon set out to produce the first Regional AA Service Assembly.

From his past experience with NCC, Stan determined that the best location, geographically and for all concerned, would be Fresno, California, and he contacted the Fresno Convention Bureau and tentatively arranged to reserve the Convention Center located at 700 M Street, for the dates January 26-28, 1968. He sent a questionnaire to all Pacific Region Area delegates and committee chairmen, requesting particulars to go forward with planning a program for this assembly. Eric B., State of Washington, had just been elected Pacific Regional Trustee, and Stan got in touch with him at once to request his presence. Eric so agreed, and was to be featured as the Friday night speaker. Stan determined the name of this assembly would be the "Western General Service Assembly." A chronological diary of Stan's actions, entitled "Story of the First Western General Service Assembly," is part of the PRAASA history documents and CNIA formally agreed to be co-host for this assembly. In addition, North Coastal volunteered an advance of \$500 as expense money to carry this action forward. This sum later was repaid to the CNCA treasury. The first Western General Service Assembly was held as scheduled with some 300 paid registrants (an actual count taken at the Saturday night meeting showed 500 people present).
